of me William Williams of the Parish of Dorchester in the County of Dorset Sheriff Sheriff I will and desire that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses be paid and satisfied Also I give and devise all that my messuages tenements and lands with the appurtenances called the Phoenix Oak separate and being in the Parish of St. Andrew in the County of Dorset and all other my real estate unto my daughter Priscilla Williams the said Priscilla Williams and assigns for ever Whereas the principal sum of five hundred pounds due to me from Mr. Henry Ann Lewis by mortgage of a house called Salisbury in the Parish of St. Andrew in the County of Dorset is wholly my own money and the sum of three hundred pounds due to me by the Priscilla Williams of the said Henry Ann Lewis by mortgage of a house called Salisbury and all the stocks bonds and furniture goods and effects upon and about the said house in my occupation are the property of me and my brother Francis in equal moieties parts and shares now I do hereby give and bequeath the said sum of five hundred pounds so as aforesaid due and owing to me from the said Henry Ann Lewis and in my moiety part and share of and in the said sum of three hundred pounds and of and in all the said stocks bonds and furniture goods and effects and all other my personal estate and effects whatsoever unto my said daughter Priscilla Williams for her own use and benefit absolutely And I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my said daughter Priscilla Williams sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set and subscribed my hand this twentieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifty one
